

The jigsaw of the **Macarthur Science** and Engineering Challenge is coming together. The sponsorship from Atlassian should be paid within a week or two. They are paying the whole of the balance. We are slowly getting our volunteer numbers up, thanks to the efforts of Rob and Beth Michie. I am still hoping for volunteers from Atlassian.

The story of Atlassian demonstrates the rewards that come from being creative in the STEM area. It was started by 2 Aussie lads in 2002. They are now both worth \$2 billion, they employ over 3,600 people and have 135 customers. Atlassian software is used by millions of users all over the World. Our planet needs great innovations if we are to avoid catastrophic climate change. Today's STEM students can be the ones that achieve it. As Joseph Sugarman said "Each problem has hidden in it an opportunity so powerful that it literally dwarfs the problem. The greatest success stories were created by people who recognized a problem a turned it into an opportunity." Even if Australia had zero increase in emissions of carbon dioxide it would not solve climate change because Australia emits only 2% of the carbon dioxide, but if we were able to supply the countries with energy at a cost much less than the price of current technologies THEN countries like India, the USA and China would not

need to burn fossil fuels and we could reverse global climate change.

The world population continues to grow, yet every year over 7 million people die of hunger. About 4 billion people, or two-thirds of the world's population, face severe water shortages during at least one month every year. With really smart agricultural technologies we could help to meet those needs, by helping poor, dry countries to grow their own food more effectively and to conserve water more effectively. These are the challenges, and opportunities, for today's young STEM students.
