- 12) Australian Shareholders' Association (ASA) will be running a project funded by an ECSTRA grant to assist women 55+ to build confidence to participate in financial decision-making. The goal of the financial literacy project, Own Your Financial Future, is to empower older women by giving them a greater understanding of basic financial concepts. These workshops are geared towards women who have never been involved in managing their finances or investments. There are workshops from March 2019 to November 2019 in many venues including Wollongong and Sydney.)
- 13) Rotary District 9640 and Griffith University have partnered in the development of and clinical trials for the Malaria Vaccine Project. It is estimated that there are 219 million cases worldwide and more than 435,000 die every year. Donations are requested to support this project. So far Rotary has raised \$500,000 and these funds were matched by the Federal Government. (See attachment for details).
