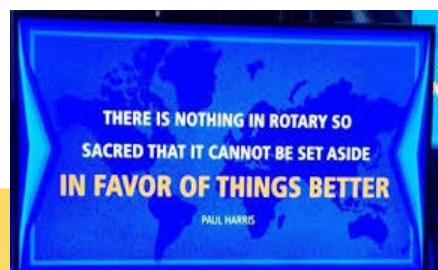

Malnutrition and other serious health problems, such as blindness, intellectual disabilities, anaemia and impaired growth are due to the lack of balanced nutrition in their diet. FPSRAG's approach is a sustainable solution to hunger, malnutrition and food security that is cost-effective and proven to work.

Food Plant Solutions get many enquiries from NGO's who need educational materials. They need to fundraise through clubs to pay for their production, translation of information, and sometimes printing. 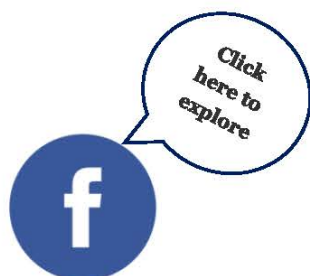

Drought relief Efforts

The Rotary Club of Cobar has been continually involved with practical support for Drought affected farmers right around the Cobar area since September 2018.

To date with valuable financial support from various Rotary Clubs in NSW and Victoria as well RAWCS as a couple of Charities and ordinary people across NSW we have been able to provide 14 road train loads of fodder to needy farmers since that time.

We have also been able to deliver some 380 grocery packs, 8 pallets of working dog food and 5 pallets of bottled water to date to these farmers as well during that time.

While the ongoing need to support these farmers is still very real and immediate the Cobar Rotary Club is now at a stage where available funding to continue this live saving work is becoming depleted and our efforts will come to a halt without additional funding by the end of 2019.

Cobar Rotary would like to continue to support our farmers and work beside them to help them survive into 2020.

We cannot underestimate the benefit that our drought relief project is bringing to farmers in western NSW.

In conversation with the wife of one of our farmers and the mother of 5 young children recently, during which we were able to advise her that we could provide her with grocery packs, dog food and fuel and fresh meat vouchers she became emotional and said knowing that somebody cares makes all the difference.

Knowing that She would be able to feed the family for a while longer and that Rotary cares would allow her to sleep now at night – something she has not done very well in recent weeks.

Cobar Rotary needs to continue the drought relief program to enable us to make a difference to many people and save lives as well.

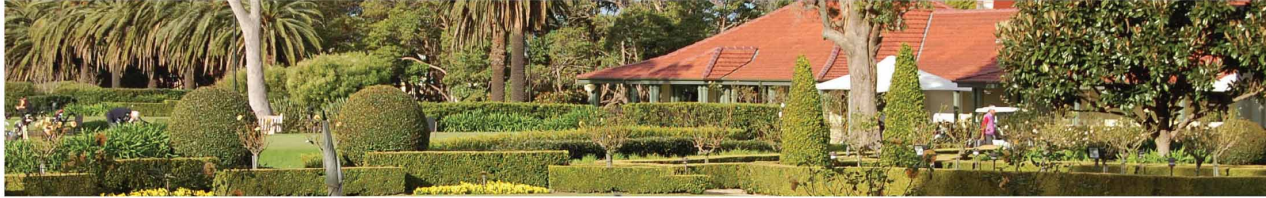

Help us celebrate our **14th Annual Charity Golf Day** to be held on **Thursday 21st November 2019** at **Concord Golf Club**, one of Sydney's most prestigious golf clubs.

Since 1899, the Club has hosted championship golf tournaments including the Australian PGA, NSW Open, ANZ Championship and now the Rotary Club of Five Dock's Annual Charity Golf Days. It is a unique opportunity for many golfers to play this magnificent course, which was redesigned last year.

Main beneficiaries will be:

ROMAC (Rotary Oceania Medical Aid for Children): provides treatment through dedicated medical and other volunteers in Australia and New Zealand for about 50 children from the Pacific region each year, in the form of life giving or dignity restoring surgery not available for them in their home countries.

Children's Tumour Foundation Of Australia: provides information, resources and support services for children and their families and adults suffering from the debilitating genetic disorder neurofibromatosis (NF), which has severe physical and psychological effects on those suffering from it.

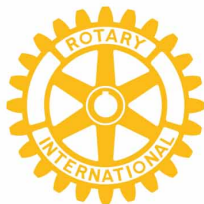
