Lisa is with Youth Off the
Streets at Macquarie Fields and is

involved with the EDEN College project.

The EDEN College is an accredited high school for young people who want to complete Year 9 and Year 10 (13 – 17 years of age). At EDEN College they work with young people who have become disengaged from education and help them to get back on the right track.

There's one teacher for every nine students at *EDEN College*. This means they can work closely with all their students and treat them as individuals.

They offer flexible programs that respond to the needs and talents of every young person who enters their classrooms. In addition to the Board of Studies approved curriculum, students have the opportunity to gain externally recognised qualifications. As well as this EDEN students don't miss out on any of the technology or services available in mainstream education

Lisa is the School Manager, at the Koch Centre for Youth and Learning. Many of the students live complex lives, Lisa told us, often including neglect as well as disabled kids and this means that they need additional support. Lisa wasn't asking for money but for volunteers for the kitchen.

We received a message from Lisa which said:

"It was great to meet you on Wednesday morning and I was touched by the reception I got from everyone.

I was quite overwhelmed by such a positive response. Could you please extend my heartfelt thanks to your group?

I had three wonderful people volunteer their time as well as so many others sharing their knowledge and contacts."
