MUNA (from Malcolm)

"Some of our newer members may be unaware of the New Generations programme titled "Model United **Nations** Assembly" (Rotary acronym MUNA). In the words of RI -'MUNA significant is international Rotary youth program'. It is a debating competition in which each school represents the views of a particular nation on a range of propositions. Why is it deemed significant by Rotary International? One of the aims of Rotary International is to promote world peace and understanding.

In order to represent the views of their nation they have been given to represent, the students research the beliefs of that nation and the rationale supporting those beliefs. (To add to the sense of occasion the schools can dress in the national costume of that nation).

One year our Club sent a team from Hurlstone Agricultural College to MUNA. Their parents came from India, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh respectively. They represented Israel! They dressed as Israelis using clothes borrowed from Philip Law's sister, Carina who was married to an Ashkenazi.

They were all brilliant, but the best, most convincing speaker was the boy of Bangladeshi parentage. He was probably а Muslim. Hurlstone students were runners up on the day. Those young people will have finished with a better understanding of the Israeli position as a result of the experience. Hence the aims of RI were advanced.

MUNA 2018 was held at the NSW Parliament House. Results:

1st - SCEGS; 2nd - Rooty Hill High School; 3rd - Blakehurst High School. Best Speaker -Max Collingwood, Fort St High School.

Days for Girls


Recently President Denise was the Guest Speaker for the Rotary Club of Ingleburn and her topic was *Days for Girls*.
