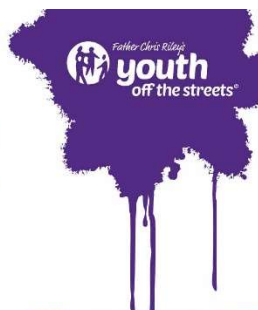

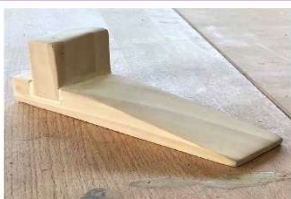

Michael is a Wiradjuri man whose involvement in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander education spans more than three decades. He is the current Pro Vice-Chancellor (Indigenous Leadership and Engagement) and Director of Jumbunna Institute for Indigenous Education and Research at UTS.



UTS is embarking on a ground-breaking proposal to build Australia's first truly comprehensive Indigenous Residential College. Once completed, the college is expected to be the largest and most significant college of its type in the world.

Michael is also a member of the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Higher Education Consortium and a regular delegate to the United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues. He is also Chair of the Bangarra Dance Theatre.

Macarthur Homelessness Facts



In 2016, 1089 people were homeless across the Macarthur region. This includes people living rough, in boarding houses and couch surfing.



Of the 1089 people across Macarthur region:

- 85% Campbelltown LGA
- 9% Camden LGA
- 6 % Wollondilly LGA



The estimated rate of homelessness across the Macarthur region is increasing. Campbelltown alone between 2011-2016 increased by 44.1% and Camden had also increased by 11.6%.
