POLICE OFFICER OF THE YEAR AWARDS

The Rotary Police Office Of The Year Awards are an opportunity for Rotary, on behalf of the community, to recognise the good work being done, day in and day out, by the majority of men and women in the New South Wales Police.

The Rotary Clubs of the Macarthur region commenced participating in 2003 in a program run by the Chamber of Commerce. This program is now run by the Rotary Clubs in the Macarthur Area.

There are five categories for the awards made and for Macarthur, these are:

- Rotary Police Officer of the Year
- · Detective of the Year
- Crime Management
- Probationary Constable of the Year
- Unsworn Officer

On the 16th of November, the NSW Police Officer of the Year event will be held in the Grand Ballroom of the Hyatt Regency, Sydney. For this event there are additional awards:

- Metropolitan Field Operations Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Metropolitan Field Operations Commands
- Regional NSW Field Operations Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Regional Fields.

- Investigations and Counter Terrorism Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Investigations and Counter Terrorism Commands
- Specialist Support Police Officer of the Year, which recognises policing excellence for sworn officers performing duties within the Specialist Support Commands
- Corporate Services Police
 Officer of the Year, which
 recognises policing excel lence for sworn officers
 performing duties within
 the Corporate Services
 Commands and Youth
 Capability and Performance Commands.

As well as these awards, there are also:

- Employee of the Year.
 Recognises outstanding commitment of civilian employees of the NSW Police Force
- Rotary Community Award. Recognises the exceptional efforts of NSW Police Force employees who have worked for the benefit of the community, putting service above self whether on or off duty
- Volunteer of the Year. Recognises the extraordinary efforts of the NSW Volunteers in Policing who, in their own time, help ensure the community is best served by their police.
