CLUB PROJECTS

DISCOBILTY: A social evening for adults who live with disabilities and their carers. Held at Harrington Park Community Centre four times each year the club provides a professional DJ with the ever popular Karaoke performances. SCIENCE & ENGINEERING CHALLENGE (SEC)

Up to 500 year 9 and 10 students attend Macarthur SEC at which the students create models (such as bridges, bionic hands, distribution networks) which are then tested by Rotary volunteers who award points. The winning school advances to the next round of competition. SEC encourages students to study STEM subjects in years 11 and 12. STEM graduates are better paid and more likely to get jobs. DOLLY PARTON IMAGINATION LIBRARY

The project provides children from birth to 5 with an age appropriate book once a month. Once the child is registered he/she receives a book addressed to them in the mail. The program is directed to low socio- economic, indigenous and disadvantaged communities. The program also assists parents and associated and community groups to be actively involved in the development of their children's literacy skills.

As the name suggests it was begun by Dolly Parton who grew up in an illiterate household.

Macarthur Sunrise Rotary Club supports 70 children on this program. The children attend Wheely Good Fun Playgroups at Claymore, St Andrews, Bradbury and Ingleburn and 2 children from the Uniting New Pin Therapeutic restoration program at Ingleburn.

To enable the club to fund this program we have been fortunate to receive funding from IMB, NSW Club Grants from West and Campbelltown City Council.

DAYS FOR GIRLS

Women and girls in developing countries live without access to products to manage their menstruation. This project is part of an international organisation that prepares and distributes reusable and sustainable hygiene kits throughout the developing world. Since beginning in October 2016 the local team has made over 400 kits and recently returned from a visit to Cambodia to deliver 250 kits in 2 remote villages.
